The Meaning of the Sacrament

Invitation to the Lord's Table

One: Jesus is our gracious host at the table set before us. As host he welcomes

any and all who love him and desire to live for him to join in this feast of love. So, come to this table, not because you must but because you may, not because you are strong but because you are weak. Come, knowing Christ loves you and gave himself for you. Come and meet him here, for we are Christ's Body, brothers and sisters who in our baptized lives live out his

death and resurrection.

*Communion Prayer

One: The Lord be with you.

Many: And also with you.

One: Lift up your hearts!

Many: We lift them up to the Lord.

One: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

Many: For it is holy and right to do so!

One: Holy and right it is, and our joyful duty to give thanks to you at all times and

in all places, O Lord our Creator, almighty and everlasting God! You created heaven with all its hosts and the earth with all its plenty. You have given us life and being, and preserve us by your providence. But you have shown us the fullness of your love in sending into the world your Son, Jesus Christ,

the eternal Word, made flesh for us and for our salvation.

For the precious gift of this mighty Savior who has reconciled us to you, we praise and bless you, O God. With your whole Church on earth and with all the company of heaven we worship and adore your glorious name:

(The congregation may be seated.)

One: Most righteous God, we remember in this Supper the perfect sacrifice

offered once on the cross by our Lord Jesus Christ for the sin of the whole world. In the joy of his resurrection and in expectation of his coming again, we offer ourselves to you as holy and living sacrifices. Together we proclaim

the mystery of the faith:

Many: Christ has died! Christ is risen! Christ will come again!

One: Send your Holy Spirit upon us, we pray, that the bread which we break and

the cup which we bless may be to us the communion of the body and blood of Christ. Grant that, being joined together in him, we may attain to the unity of the faith and grow up in all things into Christ our Lord. And as this grain has been gathered from many fields into one loaf, and these grapes from many hills into one cup, grant, O Lord, that your whole Church may soon be

gathered from the ends of the earth into your kingdom.

Many: Even so, come, Lord Jesus!

The Words of Institution and Communion

You are invited to come forward for communion by intinction (Latin, "to dip"). You may also partake in the pew either by using fellowship cups or by raising your hand so an elder may bring the communion elements to you. Children are welcome to participate with parental guidance, or they may come forward to receive a blessing from the pastor.

Thanksgiving after Communion (from Psalm 103, with additions)

One: Brothers and sisters, since the Lord has now fed us at his Table, let us praise

God's holy name with heartfelt thanksgiving! Bless the Lord, O my soul,

Many: and all that is within me, bless his holy name.

One: Bless the Lord, O my soul,

Many:and do not forget all his benefits—One:who forgives all your iniquity,Many:who heals all your diseases,One:who redeems your life from the Pit,

Many: who crowns you with steadfast love and mercy.

One: The Lord is merciful and gracious.

Many: slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love.

One: He does not deal with us according to our sins, nor repay us according to our iniquities.

One: For as the heavens are high above the earth,

Many: so great is his steadfast love toward those who fear him;

One: as far as the east is from the west,

Many: so far does he remove our transgressions from us.

One: As a father has compassion for his children,

Many: so the Lord has compassion for those who fear him,

One: who did not spare God's own Son, but gave him up for us all,

and will also give us all things with him.

Many: Therefore shall my mouth and heart show forth the praise of the Lord,

from this time forth forevermore. Amen.
