New to Central? Thank you for joining us today, whether in person or online. Our mission is to connect all people to God and to one another through scripture, sacrament, song, and service. We have been in ministry for 182 years and are a part of the Reformed Church in America, a Christian denomination that began in New Amsterdam (now New York City) in 1628. About the Apostles Creed: Reformed churches have always esteemed the ancient creeds of the church. The Apostles Creed addressed the challenge of Gnosticism, a school of belief that denied Jesus was fully human. The creed was not written by any one person or even by the apostles themselves. It dates no later than the fourth century and summarizes the apostles' teachings as a statement of faith.
