In the later Middle Ages some religious chant evolved into song (forming one of the roots of later Western music). The song “Teach Me the Way” is not exactly a chant, but a modernized chant-like song.

Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart (1756-1791) was a prolific and influential composer of the Classical era. During his last year, Mozart wrote a great deal of music including some of his most admired works: the opera *The Magic Flute*, the final piano concerto (K. 595 in B flat), the Clarinet Concerto K. 622, the motet *Ave verum corpus* K. 618, and the unfinished *Requiem* K. 626.

The Phantom of the Opera was composed by Andrew Lloyd Webber, based on the French novel *Le Fantôme de l'Opéra* by Gaston Leroux. The musical opened on Broadway, at the Majestic Theatre, on 26 January 1988 and was made into a film, directed by Joel Schumacher, and produced by Andrew Lloyd Webber in 2004.
