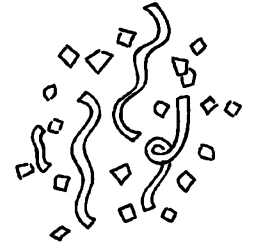

Kathy Vredevoogd, thank you for the wonderful projected pictures of nature.

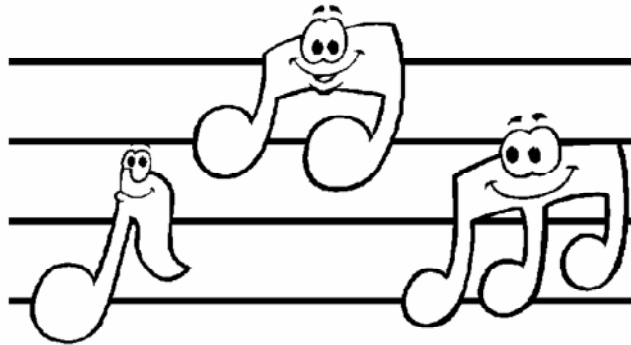
